The successful delivery of SDGs depends on building partnerships, trust and coordination of multi-stakeholders from various backgrounds. It requires an efficient engagement of non-traditional stakeholders such as faith actors and faith based organisations (FBOs) that are the immediate service-providers and first point of contact for many people. Faith is an integral part of the social fabric and by many it is considered as the major driver of change in local communities. Therefore, the role of FBOs and faith actors cannot be overlooked in the processes of SDGs implementation. They need to be seen as integral partners in the protection and promotion of the human rights, in particular in the prevention and elimination of violence against women and girls. And the need for capacity building of community to ensure they have both the power, knowledge, confidence and skills to be part of the decision making process.
